

Pastoral Ponderings . . .

Wiggle Room

During a trip to Russia my wife and I spent nearly a week in Moscow. On the eve of the next to our last full day we met up with an Orthodox Priest, Fr. Nikoli, who was the friend of a friend. Fr. Nikoli offered to come pick us up to be our tour guide for the day. He asked what we'd like to see. I told him that we'd already toured the Kremlin, the Church of the Master, and the Tretyakov Gallery. We had seen Moscow, but felt we hadn't seen Russia.

The next morning, he arrived at the door of our hotel and took us about 60 kilometers east of Moscow where he was serving a church. The church building's construction was nearly complete. Inside was full of scaffolding and he offered me the opportunity to climb up to see the frescoes that were being painted on the ceiling. They were magnificent. After the tour of the church, his mother met us outside. That morning she had hand shoveled through 300 yards of snow that was three feet deep to create a path from the church building to their house. She arrived pulling a sled behind her. The sled was for our 23-month-old son, Daniel. She bundled him up with blankets and secured him on the sled. Then she led us to their house where she was preparing a feast for us to eat.

While lunch was being cooked, Fr. Nikoli and I had a long conversation about the empty farms we passed along the way. He told me that no one was working those farms any longer because, with the fall of the Soviet Union, the state was no longer employing people to do so. I never imagined that I would ever have a conversation about the benefits of communism, and yet there we were. With the arrival of Capitalism, people were now unemployed. Their jobs may not have paid much, but they had a reason to get up in the morning, labor that helped them rest at night, and enough money to provide a simple life for their families. He wasn't trying to convert me to communism, (I wasn't), just to show me that it wasn't all bad.

In his book, Travel as a Political Act: How to Leave Your Baggage Behind, Rick Steves writes, "Travel challenges truths that we were raised thinking were self-evident and God given. Leaving home, we learn other people find different truths to be 'self-evident.' We realize it just makes sense to give everyone a little 'wiggle room.'"

It seems to me that wherever we may travel this summer, across the country, around the world, or through the garden gate, giving everyone "a little wiggle room" is a good idea. It's also a great model for a life of faith. When we're open and honest with one another, we will discover that we don't all believe the same things. Yet, "a little wiggle room" for differing views can help us all grow in faith as individuals and stronger as a community.




College and High School Graduates







Habitat works toward this vision by building and improving homes in partnership with individuals and families in need of a decent and affordable place to live.



They rely on equipment, supplies, and financial donations from various organizations, along with household, furniture, and other personal donations to their Restores. The profits from the Restores supplement the other expenses needed to execute on their vision. You would be amazed what you can find if doing any home projects to support your efforts!

We have been partnering with Habitat for Humanity of Washington & Dodge Counties. This past winter and spring we've been working on two houses in Juneau hanging drywall, mudding, and sanding. We're looking forward to painting, installing trim, doors, floors, and cabinets. No skill or experience is needed when volunteering with Habitat. They provide all the knowledge, training, equipment, and supplies; all you have to bring is your water, lunch money or pack a lunch! The tasks they offer are based on your skill, interest, and willingness to learn. We tend to book the third Saturday of the month. They will be finished with the Juneau houses late spring and planning to start breaking ground on a West Bend house this summer. The New Family Promise Shelter is now OPEN! Looking for Volunteers

June 27th, July 25th, August 22nd, September 26th & October 24th from 5-8 pm

This is a great opportunity for volunteers to once again interact with the families. Since it has been such a long time since we have hosted families in our churches, ALL must be retrained in order to help with this new program. Below is what is required to complete the training process.

Step 1: Complete online training

Online training includes two sessions with modules, which can be done at your own pace. Volunteer 101 is about 15 minutes and covers overview info about Family Promise. Volunteer 102 takes about 75 minutes and goes into more detail about working with families experiencing homelessness. These sessions need to be completed before attending the in-person training. This is for everyone regardless if they have gone through training before.

Begin here: ONLINE TRAINING

Step 2: Participate in an in-person training. https://www.familypromisewaukeshawi.org for dates and times

Step 3:Complete a background check

More information for the volunteer training process:

- All volunteers over the age of 16 must be fully trained
- Two online sessions are required as well as one in person

There are so many benefits from this sale. We provide an easy place for items to be donated year-round. We have volunteers who will pick up these items from folks who cannot get them to church themselves. We offer items that have been donated to people in need throughout the year. In addition, the fellowship we receive by working together is very rewarding! There are so many interesting and wonderful people who belong to our church. The sale gives us a reason to work together for the betterment of our church community.

This year we were able to donate clothing and bikes to the local Bethany Recovery Center. Bethany helps women struggling with drug or alcohol abuse or addiction. When the women arrive there, they often have very little. The bikes help them have transportation to get to and from work as they start to rebuild their lives. We gave many pairs of shoes to Soles for Jesus and provided non-saleable linens as stuffing for sleeping bags for the homeless. We continued our long tradition of providing clothing to New Hope church in Milwaukee. New Hope gives clothing to those in need.

Please mark your calendars for the Fall Rummage Sale on November 4, with large church set ups after church on October 22 and 29. Items can be dropped off in the unfinished space any time after June 1 for the fall sale. As you find items to donate, please use this rule of thumb. If you wouldn't give it to a family member, it most likely will not be purchased at the sale. 
