Y'all – despite the snow, in just over a week Easter will be here! And as big as that is, these few days between now and Easter are the only reason that Easter means anything at all. The wild joy of Jesus' donkey-back ride into The City, on a carpet of clothes and palm branches, turns sour in the next days when the crowd realizes that he is NOT leading a full-frontal insurrection against the Roman army.

On their last night together, Jesus wraps a towel around his waist and washes his disciples' feet. He shows them that a daughter or son of God conquers by serving, not by violence. He leaves them a feast of his ongoing presence in the bread and the cup. Afterward, he goes out to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray that what is about to happen not happen – but for God's will to be done either way.

Instead of starting a holy war against the Romans, or pulling a fast escape out of thin air, Jesus is betrayed, arrested, tried, mocked, scourged, nailed to a horrific tool of torture, dies, and is buried in a sealed tomb. This Jesus - the Anointed One – conquers our God-forsaking human cruelty and sin by absorbing it. He conquers it by trusting in the power of God's love more than in the power of God's retribution. This Jesus was not in that tomb on the first day of the week. This Jesus appeared to two disciples walking to Emmaus later that afternoon. This is the Jesus by whose promise and presence we have tasted the feast of eternity. Jesus lives! The risen Lord lives, bringing forgiveness to lives pulled into the quicksand of bitterness or guilt; bringing healing to bodies, minds, spirits, and communities; bringing grace and a restoring welcome to people pushed to the edges because of their past, their poverty, skin color, or who they love; bringing food to the hungry and hope to the hope-starved.

Friends, this is THE Good News! With the old disciples, and as the new disciples, we must share it – share it by our actions, by our following of Jesus, share it even with words if we have to. This Good News is urgently needed in a broken and bleeding world. This Good News is the only reason church exists at all.

First, I ask you to pause, and breathe, and take the Good News to heart for yourself. He said, *"I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."* Breathe that in. Deeply. This LIFE is for you. Then, I ask you to invite someone you know to worship, someone for whom Jesus' touch would bring freedom, wholeness, laughter, mercy, or some other new beginning. Because this LIFE is also for them. Whoever they are. Wherever life has brought them.



In just over a week, Easter will be here. And though it is short, there is a journey from here to there. My prayer for you is that on this journey you find breathing space, a new sense of what really matters, and a reawakened yearning to follow Christ and live with the joy of his Good News – which shall be for all the people.

Moderator Musings

At Bible study last week we talked about abundance in relation to Christ's miracle of the loaves and fishes. Many of us shared memorable stories of visiting our grandparent's home for a Thanksgiving feast. We recalled the warmth and love of family on those very special occasions. Well, coming up on April 27th our church will have the opportunity of playing the part of grandma's house for the Southeast and Southwest Associations of UCC churches in Wisconsin.

The Wisconsin Conference of the United Church of Christ is divided up into 4 districts or "associations". Our church lies on the western edge of the Southeast Association. Because of our geographic location, our accessibly to I-94, and the size of our building we have been asked to host, not only this year's Southeast Association annual meeting, but also the annual meeting for the Southwest Association.
