When I was little, we took a family vacation to the north coast of California. One morning my dad and I went out onto a rocky shoreline, about 20 feet above the roiling water. We got our rigs together and cast our lines into the heaving deep blue green. In a couple of minutes, something grabbed my line. It didn't fight like a walleye or a trout. But it took my line and swam slowly out into the open water. My kid-sized fishing rod bent all the way over, then snapped. We figured it was probably a big old Lingcod.



There wasn't much left to do. I helped my dad and took a couple of turns with his reel. Then, I just watched that dark surf crash on the rocks, after the waves had marched across thousands of miles of ocean. And it hit me deep down, how small I was, how small and ordinary any human being is, in the face of oceans and mountains and galaxies.

God shows up in all kinds of majestic things, from sunsets to music to the night sky. When we come face to face with that majesty, a reflex goes off inside us - "OMG" we pray. But the sign of real majesty in our face is that there are no words. The structure our mind gives to the world is cracked open, and we buckle in awe before what we cannot grasp.

This happened for people around Jesus. They could understand the majesty of God in mountains, or in the intense heat or cold of the desert. They could sense God at work in a raging storm, or in the perfect rendering of a passage of Torah. But Jesus was a problem: Isn't this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, 'I have come down from heaven'? (John 6:42)

We humans sense God in over-the-top moments, but often overlook the Almighty wrapped in flawed humanity right alongside us.

To the Ephesians, Paul writes: Speak truth to your neighbors... Don't let the sun go down on your anger... Work so that you something to share with those who need... Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, and be kind to each other, tenderhearted and forgiving, as God in Christ has forgiven you. (Ephesians 4)

Some would call these words "weak," or sneer at them as "woke." To me they look like "treating other humans with respect." For Paul they are signs of Christ being within us. No purple mountain majesties. No drop-you-to-your-knees miracle. You wanna see God on earth? Speak truth. Give up arguing, slander, boredom, and self-centeredness. Work so that you have plenty to give away. Forgive. Be happy. Live with God at the center of your life. Love your neighbor as yourself.

As summer deepens, I pray each of us have moments of God being near — as many of the big ones as there can be! But even more, I pray that the quietly majestic moments feed your soul each day. Because it is the flashes of "Godwrapped-in-flawed-humanity" that wash away our sin in the power of redeeming grace, that truly heal us with holy love, that truly shape the world — beginning right where we are.

August's Singing Collection

Back Bay Mission (BBM) is our August Singing Collection

...and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God. Micah 6:8

BBM, in Biloxi, Mississippi, strengthens neighborhoods, seeks justice and transforms lives. Since 1922, it has evolved to address critical needs and acts as an advocate for change. The organization honors its mission daily through programs focused on homeless prevention and providing safe spaces for the unsheltered.

Services include a housing rehabilitation program, emergency rental and utility assistance. BBM also supports the Micah Day Center, which serves the needs of unsheltered (homeless) people. When they come to the Micah Center they can shower, have their laundry done, use the telephone and computer and sign up for services with a case management and consult with representatives of a variety of health services that best fits their needs. BBM also supports a small food pantry within the BBM campus and an offsite soup kitchen, Loaves and fishes, which has a long history of support from BBM.

So as you can see, as of the end of this fiscal year, we have given back over \$100,000 (\$105,423.05 to be exact)!
