



I gotta say that I love the heat. The deep of winter is also very good, but summer is the best. As a native son of the West Coast, it's amazing to me how, once the cold begins to lift, people jump at the chance to get outside and do things, whatever the sky.

Summer can bring different rules. Even if it's infected with our need to achieve, it's still a time to wander into a slower pace. Summer creates cracks in the schedule, when we can allow fragments of our time to be claimed by grace, or healing: an afternoon at the beach; a baseball game; a nap in the shade in the back yard; a morning in a kayak, or the woods. We're taught that this "time away" is a luxury – a message which might be foisted on us by larger powers, or by ourselves. Either way, it is a lie – at least as far as the Bible is concerned:

But the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God; you shall not do any work—you, or your son or your daughter, or your male or female slave, or your ox or your donkey, or any of your livestock, or the resident alien in your towns, so that your male and female slave may rest as well as you. Remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and the Lord your God brought you out from there with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm; therefore the Lord your God commanded you to keep the sabbath day. (Deuteronomy 5:14-15)

You are who God made you to be, who Jesus Christ has redeemed you to be - fully alive and fully free to reflect the glory of Divine power and grace in this world. We are more than a small pile of minerals stirred into few gallons of water. God breathed us into being. So, what we are NOT, is slaves. We may well labor for our bread, but we are NOT mere units of production. We are not slaves of others' desire for wealth any more than we are slaves to our own desires, whatever they may be. That's the point of the exodus from Egypt. Humans are designed to be God's own beloved children - heirs of heaven. Thus, time is not our master. WE are the master of our time. And rest, sabbath, is no luxury. It is our birthright.

Maya Angelou observes: "Each of us needs to withdraw from the cares which will not withdraw from us."

So, take the time. Sure, it's already August. But, there is still time. Sit on a rock — or climb one. Read a book. Lay down in the shade and look up at the sky. Be dazzled by fireflies. Find some great music and go nuts. Resist the urge to repair cracks in THE SCHEDULE — get a crow bar and pry them wider! Practice sabbath.

And, if you just can't give yourself permission to let go, know that God already has. In fact, God has commanded it. Through rest, time away, sabbath, God feeds the peace within us, so that we can bring more of it into the world around us.

Moderator Musings

There are two questions that I am now routinely asked by fellow church members which I thought I should address in this newsletter.

1. The current status of our long standing negotiations with Cincinnati Insurance is in its final stages. The mediator, called an umpire, has been agreed to by both parties and should be looking at both our church building and the mountains of documentation that have accumulated over the past 3-years. I am hoping for his report and decision by the time this newsletter is published. This is a binding decision to both parties and I am cautiously optimistic that we have a strong position and should get a significant amount of additional monies. On a related issue the Administrative Ministry is still trying to determine which company to recommend for the repair of the Music Pod roof (as voted on at our last congregational meeting). Once that recommendation is made the Leadership Team will vote on it and work can be scheduled.



2. After a number of meetings, the Capital Fund Drive committee has decided to delay the roll out of the drive until early next year. It has been decided that a lot of the foundational work would not be ready by fall and that an outside consultant firm should be engaged to help with building the framework. Again, on a related issue the Stewardship Ministry will redirect some of its attention to the fall Annual Stewardship Campaign which is scheduled to open this September.

These are only two of the issues that I have been dealing with lately. Being the moderator for a church as dynamic as ours can be a distinct challenge and certainly time consuming. But, isn't that a good thing?

Ken Young


Ken and Kelly Young were married on July 20, 2019. Kelly has been a member of the church since her childhood, and Ken officially joined the church in May of 2025.
