For a lot of folks this is the best time of year ever. The Christmas tree goes up. The lights go up. In the winter darkness, the colors shine, and life draws closer-in, warm, with pine and cinnamon and the scent of cookies. Especially in a year that has developed as has this one, we crave the stability of some cocooning.

In Advent, the story of our faith offers a different take. As he draws near the end of his public ministry, Jesus speaks disturbing words to his disciples:

For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. Two will be working in the field, one will be taken and one will be left. Two will be grinding meal together, on will be taken and one will be left. Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming.

That's a lot. Especially when we're immersed in warm lights, soft glow, and hot cider. When Jesus goes here, our anxiety rises. It's spooky, "end of days" talk – aka apocalyptic (which simply means, "revealing"). We hear these words and our mind flips back to that time we ate the last piece of pecan pie and never admitted it, and worry that we'll be left behind. But apocalyptic is intended to be a word painting that jumbles our reality and jars us into a new way of seeing things. Jesus' apocalyptic words are not so much a prediction of our tomorrow as they are a testimony about how rickety is our today – and in Whose hands are held all our times.

That's the thing. The world around us is truly rickety. Jesus confirms this. Which is why we crave the tree and the lights and the seasonal yum. But his words undercut the self-medication of our reflexive response, leading us deeper into reality, deeper into hope. Yes, big chunks of our world are held together with duct tape and a prayer. But much bigger things are coming, things God is crafting from ahead.



Advent pulls us into a real-world, hopeful anticipation. Which means these weeks before Christmas are also <u>ADVENTure</u>. Come along with us for Greening the Church, the Live Nativity and Prayer Walk, the Blue Christmas service, and everything else you can read about in this month's Branches. As we speak, God is shaping the <u>ADVENTure</u> for your life, and for this world. Just as the birth of Jesus was a big thing God brought into the world in an unexpected way, so God is up to something big right now that will show up in ways we are not expecting.

We anticipate. We wonder. We hope. The cocooning is a great place to do this quiet work. Just know that a big reveal is ahead. And, far from the end of the world, however it comes, it will be a surprise, and a whole new beginning.

Moderator Musings

Capital Meeds Sessions

The Capital Needs Committee sponsored a series of listening sessions in October to illicit from the congregation their thoughts on the future needs of the church. Four sessions were held with 29 members attending. Three questions were asked; what future uses of the building to you envision, future uses of the church property, and do you think the congregation will support a capital needs campaign. The aggregate responses to those three questions are below:

Question 1: Besides addressing the immediate and known needs do you have thoughts on other potential facility improvements?

- Improve parking lot lighting.
- Replace outside doors (some exterior doors are really interior doors).
- Insure that there is an adequately funded facility contingency fee.
- Update all interior lighting to LED.
- Side church building rather than paint.
- Upgrade sanctuary technology (i.e. new screens, increased cameras for service streaming).
- Redecorate sanctuary (i.e. new wallpaper, painting).
- Small indoor chapel.
- Install/upgrade to make church more appealing as a wedding venue.
- Use unfinished space as:
 - Youth hostel or activity center
 - Mental health clinic or meeting facility

Question 2: We have a fairly large and beautiful church property. Do you have any thoughts or ideas for how we could further maximize the use of our existing property in the future?

- Create a senior center.
- Build a warehouse for rummage sale so unfinished space could be repurposed.
- Relocate or provide additional space for food pantry
- Multi-sport, multi-use indoor athletic facility primarily designed for youth activities.
- Build a Day Care Center for adults.
- Create an outdoor wedding venue.
- Build a soccer field or other athletic complex.
- High/low ropes course.
- After-school youth center to include transportation services.
- Build a regular cemetery in addition to Memorial Garden.
- Build an "Imagination Station" like kids park.

Question 3: Do you think members of the congregation would be willing to support and invest in a capital needs campaign if one is brought forward in the coming months? What type of information do you feel people will need to make an informed decision?

- Church has always responded in the past when asked to provide financial support.
- Important to communicate current needs versus future ideas.
- With current economy uncertain it may be difficult to get members to give.
- If a consultant is hired, clearly detail cost.
- Consider some sort of permanent recognition such as donor bricks.
- Church will give but including new projects beyond maintenance will get more people onboard.
- Have small group sessions at members houses and invite those members that you may not know well to come and discuss campaign.

Moderator Musings Continued

The Capital Needs Committee met on November 11 and reviewed the aggregate responses and came away with three conclusions:

- 1. While many of the ideas presented were good and worthy of future discussion there was no consensus from congregation members on one or two projects to pursue. In other words, there was no one idea that was suggested that more than one or two attendees were passionate about.
- 2. The one repeated comment at all the meetings was the need to address the necessary repairs to the church building.
- 3. Given the short timeline between the anticipated completion of our insurance settlement and the initiation of a capital campaign next year it was felt that it was impossible to pick a future project (i.e. athletic complex, adult day care, side chapel addition), come to consensus, plan, and collect bids.

Therefore the Capital Needs Committee is recommending that our future campaign focus on current building and property needs and use the input given by congregation members to develop plans in the next 3-5 years. This recommendation was presented and approved by the Leadership Team at their November meeting. 


A Heartfelt Thank You from the Caring Connection Committee



Thursday was a beautiful day, Eleanor came home with us!

We are elated and feel unbelievably blessed. In many ways this has the same feel as when a newborn comes home. She has been doing really well and getting plenty of attention from her siblings. :)

Laura and I are adjusting to a new routine and it is nice being home Together rather than split between the Hospital, Ronald McDonald House, and Home.

She will have weekly clinic follow ups for the first 6 weeks along with PT, OT, and Speech visits. Those will slow to Bi-weekly, and then monthly as she progresses. She is on many medications (around 15) and those will slowly taper off over the next 12 months. A few she will be on the rest of her life to prevent rejection.

Her immune system is vulnerable from the anti-rejection meds, especially in the first year after transplant. Although we would love to have many visitors welcome her home, caution is necessary in the near term. We plan to continue updating this CaringBridge page (at least monthly). There is also her instagram page Aunt Megan has been running (@eleanorsarmy2025) where we will continue updates also.

We have met some of the most amazing people during our stay at Children's Hospital. The work ethic, dedication, teamwork, and wisdom there is truly amazing. And what will stick with us forever are the friendships, conversation, friendly waves, and laughter that made our days so much easier.

The prayers, messages, cards, and gifts from all of you, Eleanor's Army, have helped our Family and Eleanor persevere and drive forward. We appreciate you so much.

We are better people Today than we were 9-1/2 months ago. We are grateful for every lesson, ounce of wisdom, courage, and despair we have experienced.
