Summer Sermon Series: Your Questions?

We talk about God's "grace" all the time, but what does that really mean?

I am 89 years old, so how can I be a "child of God?"

Should I come to church even if I am feeling really grumpy?



Maybe one of these connects in your gut, or maybe others gnaw at you. None of us live into Christian faith without questions. To paraphrase Frederick Beuchner, questions are the ants-in-the-pants of faith. As I prepare a sermon each week, I try to respond to the questions that grow out of the scriptures for that day. But, on my own, I cannot know your specific underlying questions, which may be very different from mine.

During July and August, our worship services will step away from the lectionary scripture readings, and I will be tackling your questions of faith. But, in order to do that effectively, I need to hear from you! What are those questions? What does not get enough attention in church, as you see it? What gets talked around in circles, but never addressed straight-up?

On the first three Sundays of June, you are invited to write down and put into the offering plates a question or two related to Christian faith and/or life, something (or things) that you think need more attention, that matter to your walk with Christ in this time and place. Look for the insert in your morning bulletin, write down your question(s), and pass them in. I have no idea exactly where this will lead us, but I'm looking forward to the journey!



Intro to Revelation Bible Study - 6:30pm Mondays June 2, 9, 16

It's not "lions and tigers and bears, oh my!" It's more like – "Spirits and lampstands and dragons and archangels and trumpets and seals and scrolls and plagues and... O my heavens!"

An amazing piece of late first-century apocalyptic writing, the Revelation has beguiled readers for nearly two millennia. Originally something that fed the hope of Christians experiencing the violent side of the Roman empire, the interpretation of its varied and dynamic symbols has shifted in the last two hundred years. But, what did Revelation mean for its first hearers? What was its purpose? Why the dramatic images? And, if it is not a coded agenda for the end of the world as we know it, what can it mean for us now? Join us for three very interesting sessions on the most enigmatic book of the Bible.

Moderator Musings

- Membership Drive - it has not gone unnoticed that our church membership has decreased over time. There are many reasons for this including changing demographics, the pandemic, and our own internal issues. Now that we have stabilized the pulpit (yeah, Matt) it is time to reexamine our community relationships and discover new ways to connect and encourage individuals to give our church a try. This is more than simple marketing. This is looking for ways to connect with the community on a one on one basis. The Leadership Team and the Membership Committee will be working over the next few months to come up with the "Next Big Ideas" to accomplish this. There will be opportunities for all congregation members to be a part of this process. Look forward to more information as it becomes available.

I (We) have a lot to do in the second half of 2025. Can we get it all done? Probably not but I firmly believe we can make a good start. Wasn't it an ancient Chinese proverb that stated that the longest trip begins with a single step? Let us together take some steps.

Founded in 1980, the Milwaukee Women’s Center provides comprehensive services and treatment for women, men, and children whose lives have been affected by domestic violence, addiction, mental health issues, homelessness, and poverty.

In 2024, 2,165 individuals received services and support through the Milwaukee Womens Center Division. These services included a crisis line, family support emergency shelter, free clothing and job readiness assistance, alcohol and drug treatment, and domestic violence services.

July's Singing Collection

Church World Service

Our July Singing Collection will be going to Church World Service; an international service organization. Church World Service (CWS) was born in the aftermath of World War II. At that time, the organization mobilized 11 million pounds of food, clothing and medical supplies to war-torn Europe and Asia. Shortly after, they began to welcome refugees to the United States and resettled 100,000 people in the first 10 years. Eighty years later, CWS's mission stays the same: go to where they are needed most in the world and help.



They resettle tens of thousands of refugees a year. They work with everyone from local communities to the United Nations to provide food, clean water, supplies, medical care and social resources. The CROP walk, one of the best known walks for hunger in the US, is a CWS event. Historically, if you can think of any major humanitarian crisis in any part of the world, CWS was there. And, with our help, they will continue to be there.

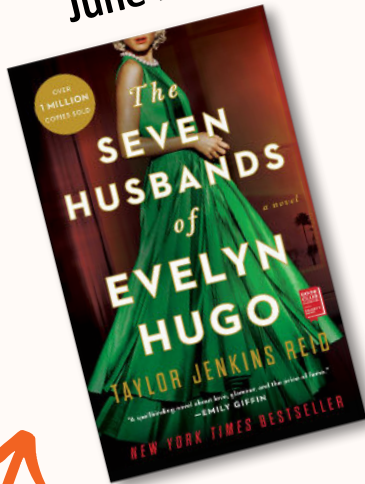

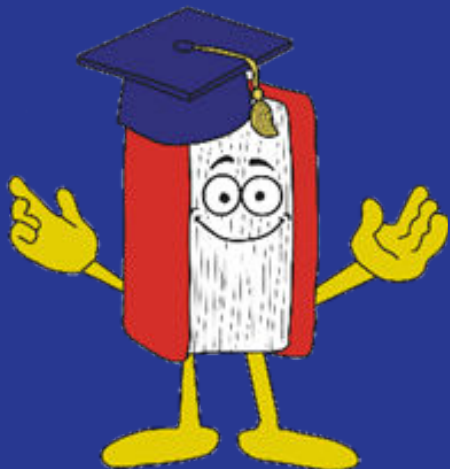
Intro to The Revelation

The Revelation to John is a vexing, obsession-sparking, and truly fascinating piece of 1st century writing that attracts both curious readers and passionate theorists. It was written for the purpose of strengthening the faith of people in seven churches spread across Asia Minor (mostly modern-day Turkey), in a time when the emperor was quietly blessing local harassment of non-compliant religious groups. We think the Revelation was written at the time of the emperor Domitian, sometime between 90 AD and 95 AD. These three sessions will explore the wider context for The Revelation, and the overall sweep of its message for its original hearers.

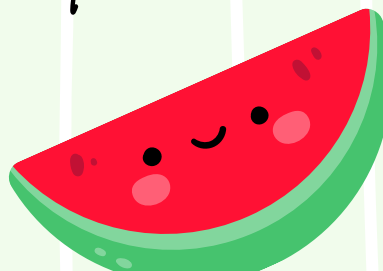
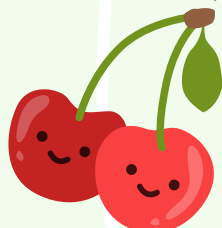

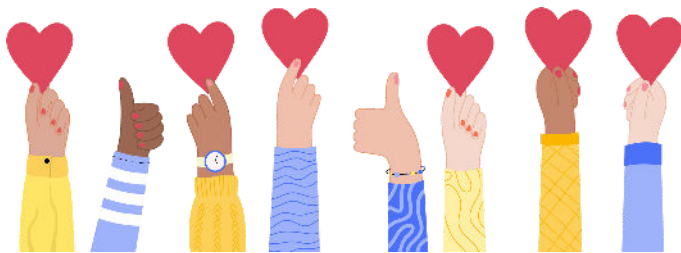
