In chapter 7 of Mark, Jesus heads to the VERY Roman coastal resort city of Tyre. He went into a house, trying to lay low. Only someone found out. A woman, whose little girl was in the grip of an unclean spirit, came right into the house, bowed low at his feet, and implored him to cast the demon out of her daughter. Jesus, tired and maybe a little hangry, said, "Let's feed the (Israelite) children first. It's not fair to throw the children's food to the dogs." But that mom came right back at him: "Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." Jesus caught himself. He said, "Because of that answer, go home and you'll find that the demon has gone out of your daughter."

This mom would not take no for an answer. She'd cried too many tears. It was time for a big change for the little one she loved. She trusted Jesus could make something good happen. And notice, Jesus credited HER attitude for the positive healing. Pause right here.

We dive into a new school year with all kinds of "stuff" happening. Maybe we can no longer ignore a problem in our body, or our job, or our home life, or one more piece of rot happening to vulnerable people in our country. A heavy weight hangs over each new day, over every decision. It's easy to get sucked into pessimism. Psychologists have found that we humans carry within us what's called a "negativity bias." It's a survival mechanism passed down from our ancient ancestors. Our brains are hard-wired to focus on fear and negativity. Long ago this helped us defend against sabertooth tigers. But now, that same "negativity bias" is fuel for everything from general crankiness to depression to conspiracy theories, and much worse.

The mom who barged-in on Jesus had no guarantee that he could do anything for her daughter. But she had a hunch. She'd heard stories. And, when at first, he dragged his feet, she leaned in: "Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." She pushed beyond her "negativity bias" and grasped the moment with a hopeful uncertainty.

"Hopeful uncertainty" is another way to say
"faith." The Letter to the Hebrews describes faith
as, "The assurance of things hoped-for, the
conviction of things not seen." We cannot see
what we hope for. It is not in our hands. But we
trust that the Lord we barge-in on is true to all we
have heard about him. We may be very uncertain,
but we trust that Christ will act in some way to
unblock positive energy, or pull us through, or
expose the fatal weakness of the demonic power
that seems to own the day.

For people of faith this is a choice. We can choose negative uncertainty, angry uncertainty, or hopeful uncertainty. Uncertainty is given. The way we approach it is not. Our approach is a choice, and it is either a choice for faith, or it is a choice for anxiety, fear, or resignation. Faith finds a home in our lives not by magic, but by our choices. And, in those choices, the Holy Spirit moves, breaking up log jams within us, changing things, bringing new life.

In addition to the full range of Fall activities you are reading about in this issues of Branches, here's a new thing: If you'd like a judgment-free space to hang with me over coffee, to talk about faith issues, and feed the hopeful part of the uncertainty we are all navigating these days, please join me at Roots Café in downtown Oconomowoc, 1PM - 3PM Tuesday afternoons.

Mission and Outreach Singing Collection

Every time we worship, loose coins in the offering are donated to a Mission Partner. The coins in the metal plates make a "joyful noise," so we call this our Singing Collection.

September Singing Collection

The STRONG program is a day treatment program that provides intensive mental health services to children and adolescents (ages 5-14) in a safe and structured setting. It is housed in Milwaukee and was formerly The Holton Youth Family Center.

Since opening its doors in early 2021. The STRONG program has been inundated with referrals for children in need of mental and behavioral health services. Referrals come from school counselors and parents.

STRONG stands for **S**uccessfully **T**reating and **R**eaching **O**ur **N**ext **G**eneration. The STRONG program recognizes the unique value of each child and acknowledges that each child deserves a chance at a successful future.



The goal of the STRONG program is to partner with schools and families to provide these children the best treatment available, allowing each child to reach their full potential.

This is achieved by using treatment combined with the love and values of Christ. Including God's love and grace into treatment allows them to reach children on all levels as they help them grow STRONGer emotionally, behaviorally and spiritually.

Items that the Food Pantry accepts are:




