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#### Pastoral Ponderings . . . A frequent topic in all churches ...

I am active in my ministerial association and the most frequent topic at our meetings and at lunch, and at regional convocations and national conferences is how to keep the church growing from within. This means keeping our current members while at the same time growing. Too often individuals and families join but then either leave, or rarely attend, because the church does not meet their needs. And the consensus on why seems to be that a church does not keep up culturally. In the WCA association there is only one church out of approximately twenty-five that is planning a new building. In the last 10 years four churches have sold their buildings. Two are in the process of closing. One is searching for a new minister and has received no applications! The rest are ok to good. How, if at all, does this information apply to this church, First Congregational Church UCC?

First, look to new church starts in this community in the last few years. Are they thriving? Are they large? Are they culturally relevant? Are they museums? Are they keeping alive traditions that died decades ago?

How you personally respond to these questions determine the future of this church.

Second, as soon as summer arrives, and it is coming fast, we will take little time to think about church. So perhaps in the next ten days you may wish to spend some time thinking about the following questions, and then discuss them with fellow members:

During this pastoral transition what is most important to you?

How is First Church adapting for the future needs of you and your household? And for other members? And for all ages from the very young, through teen years, to young singles, to young married with children, to the older?

What can First Church do to adapt for your future needs? And for other members? And for all ages from the very young, through teen years, to young singles, to young married with children, to the older?

How is First Church adapting for your spiritual vitality?

What can First Congregational Church do to adapt for your spiritual vitality?

What broader community cues are we sensing that will help our congregation adapt to the current needs of our community and to our congregation?

If we are not where you feel we should be, then what is holding us back?

When a candidate for the Settled Pastorship looks at the videos for each service at First Church what two or three key 'values' does the candidate see just by watching the services?

Both Lay Leadership and I are interested in your responses. Each member of this church must continually invite God into our Church so it becomes His Church. Otherwise, we will become petrified. Petrified branches. Petrified of any change and growth. Remember Jesus' analogy to the vine and the branches? A vine is living, growing, vibrant, constant seed producing, and bird inviting. In the WCA what happened to the churches that closed and are in the process of considering closing? No longer alive, dead or decreasing, listless, drying up, and unappealing.

We will celebrate Jesus' Ascension on May 22 and the Holy Spirit at Pentecost on June 5, 2022. This is what Luke wrote in the Book of Acts. "In the first book, Theophilus, [which is Luke's Gospel] I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them over the course of forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. 'This', he said, 'is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.'" Acts 1:1-5.

My prayer is that the Holy Spirit always be with this church. But we have to work for it!

It was great when we heard that Rev. Ruth Costello, Co-Chair of UCC SEA Church & Ministry Team announced on April 9:


"Amy, We have reviewed your request for licensure; after reviewing your supporting materials, the Church & Ministry Team voted to approve your request. As is typical of licensures, we will review this request one year from now to see if the needs of the church still require such a licensure. We are grateful for your ministry! Grace and peace be with you."

Then on April 21 Rev. Ted Drewsen the UCC Bridge Associate Conference Minister wrote to me that UCC licensed pastors use the title "Pastor"; "If she were to use her title to sign a letter, it would Pastor Amy D."

What can Pastor Amy now do in her new responsibilities? She can now officiate as a minister at Baptisms and at Holy Communion. I have asked her to employ her minister's duties at weddings and funerals if I am not available. I have also asked her to visit the sick when I am not able to. I hope everyone in this church appreciates and applauds Pastor Amy's past dedication and now new responsibilities to fulfill the ministerial needs of this church! -- Pastor Barry





FYI it takes approximately 1,128 tabs to make 1 pound and each pound generates about fifty cents (0.50) from the aluminum recycler. Each year the RMH earns an average of \$6,000 from pull tabs which all goes to providing services for the guests at the Ronald McDonald House.


















# Community Garden celebrating our 12th summer


We colored eggs in class and then did an egg hunt. (Photo Near left)
