Pastoral Search Committee



The committee continues to meet with candidates regarding their interest in possibly becoming our Pastor. After reviewing their profile and on-line sermons if they are available, we start with a Meet and Greet via Zoom which is very casual and allows us to get a feel for their personality. After that we move to an interview if our committee and the candidate are interested in pursuing getting to know each other with more depth.



Chrismons, long time Christian symbols, have been made by our Church members over the years.

They are part of our Church's heritage. These delicate, ivory items embellished with gold and pearls will be displayed during Advent. Please take a moment to enjoy them and read what they signify.

"Chrismon" is a combination of the words "Christ" and "monogram," and means "symbols of Christ." Chrismons are gold and white, representing majesty and purity. Ideas for fashioning them are developed from early Christian symbols, the Bible and church histories.
