

Pastoral Ponderings . . . God's Holy Spirit - Offered for your reflection by Pastor Barry

Humanity's ideas of God and how the Trinity works among us are formed as history unfolds. The ancients, coming out of the stone age into the Bronze and Iron Ages, wondered and, with God's Holy Spirit, Genesis and The Torah was formulated. Then the Prophets wrote in times of turbulence. Jesus, who fulfilled the Law and taught us more, and then was resurrected, lived in the unrest of Israel under Roman oppression. The Middle Ages were times of religious unrest and the resulting political upheavals in Europe.

During the time of the Reformation Philip Melanchton was a colleague of Martin Luther. Melanchton was the first systematic theologian of the Protestant Reformation, and author of the 'Augsburg Confession'. He found solace in the Third Person of the Holy Trinity, the Holy Spirit. He wrote "We never sense the benefits of God unless our heart has already been purified through the Holy Spirit and God's kindness has been imprinted on a pure and pious heart." I pressed to find further background. After Melanchton studied the Book of Genesis he focused on how the 'Spirit of God' was moving over the waters. He wondered, "How does the Spirit of God move above the waters?" He found his answer, not in Europe's theologians, but in the words of a Syrian. The Syrian said that 'God moving above the waters' has the same meaning as 'keeping something warm with one's body heat, as a sitting hen warms her eggs.' Through the Syrian theologian Melanchton had a personal experience of God's Spirit who "warms, nourishes, teaches" us. With his understanding of God's Holy Spirit, he wrote a prayer addressed directly to the Holy Spirit. [I set it out below].

What of us? We are wondering what Age we are leaving and what New Age is coming. We live in a time of turbulence and unrest world-wide. Peoples of many nations live under oppression. For many individuals these are times of religious strife. In our uncertainty we question why so many are insecure and anxious. Why does a lack of confidence in our institutions, both political and religious, flourish in a seemingly modern age. However, when we ask these questions, we are also questioning God. So, what did Philip Melanchton, living during the unrest and confusion of the Reformation, find in God's Spirit? Philip called the Holy Spirit 'The Comforter'. Why? Because he discovered, all during the turmoil of the Reformation, that the Holy Spirit gave him solace, gave light to his soul, ruled him with consolation, made him holier, and bolstered his faith in God. When he wrote his prayer he echoed Psalm 23:6: "Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord my whole life long."

This is Philip Melanchton's prayer. During these times may we find it helpful for our prayers:

"Almighty and Holy Spirit,
The Comforter,
pure, living true
— illumine, govern, sanctify me,
and confirm my heart and mind in the faith,
and in all genuine consolation;
preserve and rule over me
so that dwelling in the house of the Lord,
all the days of my life,
I may behold the Lord
and praise him with a joyful spirit,
and in union with all the heavenly church. Amen."

Sunday School News!

We are very excited to get this new school year started and can't wait for our halls to be filled with laughter, engagement, and fun from God's greatest gifts! None of this would be possible without the selfless willingness of dozens of people that have said "Yes!" and stepped forward to teach Sunday School! We are so blessed and thankful!

This year our teachers will continue to implement the Rotation model for children 3 years old through 4th grade! Each month we will focus on a specific Bible story while the children actively engage in an activity. Our 3-4 year olds will stay in the preschool room while our 1st-4th graders will rotate weekly between the Art, Games, STEM, and Story room.

As most students are back in school, they are paying attention to their new teachers hopefully like Jesus' followers did when he talked about the Beatitudes. In September we will begin with exploring the Beatitudes through fun and engaging games and activities to help the children learn more about the Beatitudes. Our Middle and High School Youth will also be discussing the Beatitudes through a 4-week study. They will find ways to invite God to adjust their attitude as they ease towards the new school year.


Become a Sponsor for New Members
