When Moses first brought the Ten Commandments down from the mountain, things did not go as planned. He stumbled into a desert rave party - which was not how things were supposed to work. In anger he threw down the first set and they broke apart. Then, when Moses brings down the second set of stone tablets, it's a different story. The golden calf and the DJ were long gone. The people were back on a strict diet of manna, but there was something strange about Moses: his face was shining. After being in God's presence, he was radiating light. It was WEIRD. So, after he gave them the new set of commandments, Moses put a veil over his face. Because the shining was too much for people to bear.

A similar thing happens to Jesus on the mountain of the Transfiguration, when Peter, John and James see Jesus standing with Moses and Elijah. A strange glowing cloud descends on them. A voice is heard coming from nowhere and everywhere, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!"

I have seen people light up a room when they walk into it, but I have never seen real light radiating from a face. At least the kind of light that made me uneasy. I wonder if this face-light from being in God's presence is like a battery is charged from electricity coming from beyond itself? Or, is this light something that we all have naturally within us? Do we naturally shine with light, but over time learn to veil it – so that others won't freak out when we are freely and openly being who we are in the world?

We celebrate moments like these on
Transfiguration Sunday, which this year is February
11. So, on the 11th, come to worship dressed in
costume – be a monster, dancer, cow-hand, Ariel,
the Mario brothers, Harry Potter, or anything else
you can imagine! In the service we will bury our
Alleluias. Then, bring your favorite decadent
sweet-dessert-thing to share for coffee hour. And
be prepared for games.

Three days after this Transfiguration "Carnival Party Sunday," we step into Lent on Ash Wednesday. To prepare for the transforming grace of Easter, we will come through a time of taking off our masks and becoming more truthful about ourselves – to God, to each other, AND to ourselves.

It is easy to accept the labels that others put onto us, or to stick others with labels that don't reflect who they really are. It is easy to believe the failures OR the fantasies we tell ourselves. A large part of the turning (or "repentance") involved in Lent is the shedding of these false stories about ourselves or others, which are the root of "the sin that clings so closely," as Paul says. Because by repeating them, we mask others' light AND we mask the light shining from within us. The labels, the names, and the negative self-talk swallow the light that is meant to shine. Lent begins in ashes and ends in the upper room. Along this path we have a new opportunity to take off the masks and let the light do what God means it to do.

I pray for each of us a real encounter with God, whether on a mountain or in a valley, at the peak of awesome or in the depths of humdrum.

Because God doesn't NEED a mountaintop to catch us by surprise, and bathe us in grace, and send our lives in new directions. All God needs is a crack in the hard shell, and a longing for something better. So, let Grace find those cracks. Take-in the light that God wants to give. And bring the shine!

#### **Moderator Musings**

I always thought that one of the hardest jobs in our church was not being Moderator or a Ministry Chair but was being in charge of getting people to serve on the church's various ministries or committees.

Normally this function is handled by the Nominating Committee but this year, after many years of service, the Nominating Committee's last member stepped down. According to the church constitution if the Nominating Committee is vacant it befalls on the Leadership Team to fill that function and thus, as your current Moderator, I also became the Chair of your Nominating Committee.

My first action was to figure out which members of the various ministries and committees were in mid-term, which were eligible for another term, and which had served the maximum number of years and needed to be replaced. Given our current organizational structure our church currently has roughly 70 positions that need to be filled annually. Around 1/3 of those serving are mid-term meaning that they are in the second of their 2-year terms. Another 1/3 are eligible to continue serving but need to be re-elected for another term. The final 1/3 have served three 2-year terms and are no longer eligible for re-election to the same ministry or committee (our church constitution limits most positions to a 6-year limit). Those members need to be replaced with someone new.

So having determined who needed to be reelected and who needed to be replaced I reached out to the various chairs and asked them to query those members who were eligible for reelection if they were willing to continue serving and for those who were terming out who might we ask to join a ministry or committee. I am gratified and humbled to report that nearly all those who could have indicated that they will continue to serve and for those positions that members have termed out we have had others offer to step up. There are only a few "open" slots!

Maybe you have felt it too but I am becoming more aware of a new energy that is permeating our church. Usually getting members to take on positions is hard. This year it was relatively easy. It is apparent that the Spirit is moving among us and there is a new commitment to doing God's work. Maybe this nominating job isn't that hard.

Lent is a time of spiritual renewal and reflection in preparation of Good Friday and celebrating Easter Sunday. These 40 days are an opportunity for us to draw closer to God. Journey with us through Lent with a variety of opportunities.

Whatever it is, write it on an Alleluia seed and bury it in our Lenten flowerbed to offer to God. As our Alleluias germinate we will see what happens to them when we celebrate on Easter Sunday. Alleluia Seeds will be available on the narthex table or you can print them at home and bring them with you to church. You can bury your Alleluias anytime throughout Lent.

You can also journey through Lent with us with a Lenten Calendar. Each day will be provide a different idea or activity to help you draw closer to God. Lenten Calendars will be available on the narthex table.

Beginning Monday, February 19 Pastor Matt will begin a Lenten Monday Night Bible Study beginning at 6:30PM in the music room. Please watch your emails as more information will be available. We look forward to you joining us! Lent is a time to draw you closer to God, but it is also a time for you to draw closer to others. Join us on February 25 as we come together as a church family for a Game Day! What better way to draw closer to others than playing a familiar game you know or learning a new one.

As we travel through Lent and approach Holy week there will be a prayer walk through the stations of the cross along the walking path outside on **March 18**. After the Breakfast with the Easter Bunny come travel in prayer through the stations of Jesus' final earthly moments. The stations will be set up in Fellowship Hall and the music room the week of **March 24** for those who prefer to walk through them indoors.

These are only a few options for you to partake in during the season of Lent. Please continue to watch your emails for other opportunities.





# Mertal Health

Did you know that one in every five adults experience a mental illness. One in every three young adults (18-25) experience a mental illness. And one in every 6 youth (12-17) experiences a major depressive episode. When you are sitting in church you are most likely sitting next to or near someone who is or has experienced a mental illness. These numbers are staggering and as a church family we can offer support.

We have formed a Mental Health Task Force who will begin to discuss ways that our congregation can learn how to talk and listen with others about mental health, recognize warning signs, and to be supportive. 






## Youth Group (3rd-12th Grade)
