
In the day or so leading up to New Year's Eve a month ago, I saw a couple of different mash-ups of television news teams or talk-show hosts riffing on the general theme of, "I can't believe it's already New Year's!" Or "Wow, how did we get to 2026 so fast?" Or, "I can't believe it! How is it already January?!?"

Actually, we got here one day at a time. Just like always. There is literally no variation in that pattern. It is the only way we can get to the next year. And, even if you were heavily sedated for months, the surprise lies not in the amount of time it takes to get to the new year, but in our finally seeing the reality that has relentlessly come upon us.

This new year has brought us as a people to a very new time. But, talking about it and within it is not easy for us these days. We are more dug into our trenches on different sides of what some refer to as a "culture war" than we ever have been. The stakes get raised, it seems, weekly. "How did we get here?!?" And with our news coming from single-but-different sources, conversations that could be held reasonably in another time, now are first met with suspicion. For all of us. Which means it is more complicated to communicate with the folks around us than ever before – including in church. And, the stakes are higher for miscommunication than we ever have known.

Being church together, across the divides, is more important than ever - leaning into hard conversations, letting the love of Christ be fuel for the hard climb. I welcome conversation about any of the issues pressing on us these days – from within the church or the wider community. I invite you to drop by Roots Café most Tuesdays, anytime 1pm-3pm, or to call to set up another time to connect with me. My schedule is flexible enough to find all kinds of possibilities.

Lent begins on **Ash Wednesday, February 18**, with a 7pm service at First Congregational UCC, in cooperation with our friends from Good Shepherd United Methodist Church. Beginning the following evening, **Thursday February 19**, there are two offerings. You are invited to a half hour of quiet **Meditation and Prayer beginning at 6pm**. Attend just that, then head home. Or, stay for a **Bible study on the Gospel According to Matthew, beginning at 6:30pm**. Finally, beginning **February 25**, there will be a joint service of worship **each Wednesday at Noon at 1<sup>st</sup> Congregational UCC**, and at **5pm at Dr. Martin Luther Church** (325 S. Main, Oconomowoc).



More than ever we are called to be church together across divides both simple and complex. We need prayer, to lay down the angst and let the light of Christ soak into us more deeply. And we need, again and again, to dwell in the life of Jesus walking among us on this earth, to find more clues for how to live as people who follow him and do the ministry he has given us to do in his name.

We don't get to choose the time in which we live. But we are the only ones who can live in it with faith and good hope. And, whatever we are facing, we don't do it alone. Ever.

## Moderator Musings

I have always felt that starting a new job, whether it is one that provides financial gain or one that provides only non-financial benefits, is a humbling experience. Despite qualifications or previous experience, most of us find out rather quickly how much we don't know. Becoming the Moderator of this congregation is no different. Though I have been a member for 25 years and have served in many church leadership roles, including as Moderator, I know that I have much to learn. I will count on all of you to help me as we begin our next church year and ask for your patience and grace.

Chris Mol has made my new job both easier and harder. He has been a steady hand in guiding this congregation through the challenges of finding a new senior pastor and the frustrations of our insurance claim for hail damage, as well as numerous other day-to-day issues in the operation of this church. Because of his level-headed and wise leadership, I take over the position of Moderator in a time of relative financial and mental stability for the congregation as a whole. That makes my job easier. But Chris is a hard act to follow, so I begin with some trepidation about living up to the high bar he has set. On behalf of the congregation, I extend heartfelt appreciation to Chris for his dedication and hard work over the previous three years. Thank you, thank you, thank you!



At the next Leadership Team meeting, we will develop our goals and priorities for the coming year and publish those to the congregation. We will continue the legacy that Chris leaves of being transparent about what church leadership is doing and communicate openly and honestly with the congregation. We pray that the insurance settlement will finally be behind us this year and that it will allow us to complete the necessary repairs to our building. I want to continue our journey to become a WISE congregation as mental health continues to be a concern for our country and our community. Finally, I hope that we can explore and develop action plans to engage with our neighbors and community. In a time of divisiveness and polarization in our country, it is incumbent on us as Christians to reach out to our neighbors and be a light in the community. I hope that we can all find ways to become more engaged. No one can do everything but we can all do something to extend the love of Jesus to all.

### February Singing Collection

February's Singing Collection is for the Bethany Recovery Center in Oconomowoc. The Center is a branch of Bethany Christian Services, a nationwide organization. Bethany Recovery Center is a rehab center where women can address harmful drug and alcohol use and addiction. The Center provides residential care in a small, caring environment by professionals trained in addiction, trauma and family-centered care. Rehabilitation at Bethany is all encompassing.



The women receive physical, mental and emotional care for both their addictions and their depression, anxiety, PTSD and any other mental health needs. Pregnant women receive health care and those with infants receive care and education in parenting. The care goes beyond their walls as the families of residents watch their loved ones heal and become whole once again. It truly is a wonderful organization that would welcome all forms of support. Please give generously this month and help local women receive the care and love they need.



Dearest Members and Staff of First Congregational UCC,


My heart is full!

Our Lenten journey begins on February 15 as we pack our Alleluias away during worship. Throughout Lent, the word “Alleluia” will be set aside in both spoken word and song creating space for reflection and anticipation. During the Children’s Message, we’ll also literally pack our Alleluias into a suitcase as a visual reminder of this season of waiting.

We’ll see what becomes of our packed Alleluias when we arrive at Easter morning.

As we travel through Lent, our children and youth will explore the events leading up to Easter in a hands-on, engaging way. Each child will receive a Lenten Passport and participate in weekly lessons.

After completing each lesson, they’ll receive a stamp in their passport marking another stop along the journey.
