

May is National Mental Health Awareness Month in the United States. These 31 days are dedicated to raising awareness about mental health, reducing stigma around mental health issues, and strengthening access to care and support for persons who live with mental health challenges. A group has formed in our church, the WISE (Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, Engaged) Team, to help us focus our thoughtful, prayerful attention on becoming a more mental-health-aware church. Our goal is to create a more welcoming and understanding environment for persons working through mental health challenges.

Across our culture the number of people living with mental health concerns is growing — not just because in 2025 we do a better job of tracking such things, but in real terms. The ways we live, enmeshed in our personal technology, narrow political silos, with fewer people involved in group things from dancing to curling to Rotary to churches to the Masonic order, and less time spent in physical work outdoors, increasing consumption of ultra processed foods — all these and more have a real effect on our overall health, including our mental health.

It is very much the role of the church, not only to provide information about Jesus to inquiring people, to offer the public worship of God, to educate people on the central things of Christian belief, and to take up service work outside the congregation in Christ's name.

It is also the role of the church to follow Jesus, to be guided by the Holy Spirit in arranging its common life to reflect the Jesus we meet in all four gospels. We do this by leaning into his way of meeting people where they are, as they are, and responding to them with respect and grace. The ways Jesus encountered the shamed and the hurting and the sick give us clues to the ways we should be in the community. The WISE approach gives us a structure to meet people where they are, with a Christlike focus and intentionality. If we are to faithfully engage, inspire, and connect with the people in our midst, in Jesus' name, this framework moves us in the right direction.

On the last Sunday in April our WISE Team hosted an after worship Self-Care event with four rotational offerings — chair yoga, zentangle, healthy foods, and meditation. It was a great success! Check out the article in this newsletter about the other things they are up to this month!

#### Bible Study – Intro to The Revelation

Mondays, May 5, 12, 19

The Revelation to John is a vexing, obsessionsparking, and truly fascinating piece of 1st century writing that attracts both curious readers and passionate theorists. It was written for the purpose of strengthening the faith of people in seven churches spread across Asia Minor (mostly modern-day Turkey), in a time when the emperor was quietly blessing local harassment of noncompliant religious groups. We think the Revelation was written at the time of the emperor Domitian, sometime between 90 AD and 95 AD. These three sessions will explore the wider context for The Revelation, and the overall sweep of its message for its original hearers.

This is our 5th year of participation which has raised approximately 1260 pair of shoes and \$1342.00.

Our Singing Collection for May will raise funds for shipment of the shoes to Africa.








# May 15 COME AND JOIN US AT OUR BOOKER BOOKER
