Nobody likes to face death. Not even battle-scarred veterans, on yet another sortie down a lonely desert road, backed by drones and air power on demand. Nobody wants to face death. No matter how strong the adrenalin. Death, for all our euphemisms, is still the end.

As Christians, our deepest reality is found among a people gathered by the Holy Spirit, engaged in the living Word of God, and serving a crucified and risen Lord. Whatever else makes up our lives — this is the deep, central core. Jesus lived as though death should be taken seriously for what it is. It tears you from other people, from the earth, from the life you love. Jesus took alternate routes to avoid needless confrontation with those who wanted him dead. Yet, when it WAS the right time to publicly stand for who he was in the face of big money and power, he did not flinch. In the garden, after praying "Let this cup pass from me, but nevertheless your will be done," by faith he accepted the cost of faithful living — to take a stand against death.

In church, we too, take a stand to confront death, often in very ordinary ways. We host a funeral service, listen to family stories, keep silence together. We pray, help each other hold on through the tears, make food, set up and serve and clean up after food. We give rides. By this we set a boundary. Here, death does not reign. Fear may be real, but it's not the only reality, nor the strongest. Here, the grieving and vulnerable will not be stigmatized or pushed aside, but instead will be embraced and healed. Here, there is God.

On Sunday November 5, we will celebrate All Saints Sunday. Together we will remember the beloved of our congregation who died in this past year. We will light candles, speak names, keep silence, and feel again the torn places, the ache of absence. Together with our risen Lord we will shout "Alleluia!" in the face of the beast. Together we will take a stand against the power of death, and claim the power of resurrection life that no tomb can hold.

I am so very grateful for all that you do as the family of Jesus to confront the power of death — for all the little things that add up to very big things. You bear witness that the tomb is empty and that Christ is risen — indeed! Death may come at us in all kinds of ways. But we don't take that lying down, because its Christ who truly reigns.

Participation

Recently members of the Leadership Team, led by Pat Evans, Bonnie Laugerman, and Rochelle Behling, hosted an All Ministry Meeting here at the church. The purpose of this biannual meeting was to give all Ministry-level team members important information about effective communication techniques, policy updates, and personnel changes. Unfortunately, over half the Ministry team members were not in attendance. Of our six Ministries (Stewardship, Spirituality, Mission, Education, Administrative, and Welcoming) two had only one member attend and one Ministry had no one present. I understand that we all are leading very busy lives but when nearly half of our church leaders are no shows I have to wonder if we have a participation problem.

I am reminded of a children's sermon that Pastor Steve gave many years ago. He presented a large jar which was half filled with sand. He then had the kids try to put 4 large stones into the jar which couldn't be done because the sand was taking up too much room. After the kids gave up he poured the sand out, put the stones into the jar, and then poured the sand back into the jar with the sand filling in the gaps left by the stones.


The point of the demonstration was that we, as Christians, need to determine/prioritize what is truly important (what are the stones) and what are less important (the sand).



SCRIP (RAISE RIGHT) A FUND RAISER TO SUPPORT OUR CHURCH YOUTH PROGRAMS!!


Every Sunday in Fellowship Hall there is someone selling a variety of gift cards.

Legacy Committee

The Legacy Committee is the focus for November.

A Legacy is a gift, typically monetary, given in the name of a person or stated in their Will, to provide support for individuals or to an organization after a person's death. It is a means one can use to express generosity at a level which may not have been possible earlier in one's life. This Committee oversees the Memorial Fund and the Endowment Fund.

Gifts to the Memorial Fund are given to the church in memory of loved ones. These gifts may be restricted where the family determines its use, or unrestricted for general use. The Legacy Committee oversees the receipt and disbursement of these funds.

The intent of the Endowment Fund is that the principal remains invested while earnings are used to fund the church's mission. These funds are managed by an investment firm.


Leaving a legacy to our church is an expression of gratitude and thanksgiving towards God for that I have been given and enjoyed in my life.
